What to Do About a Neighbor's Noise - FindLaw

The Environment Protection Act 1970 says it ' s an offence to make unreasonable noise from a residence. Any noise from a residence at any time may be unreasonable. A residential property includes: any land, building or outbuilding used in connection with a residence. This includes driveways, sheds and workshops.

### Noise & Nuisances - Neighbor Law - Guides at Texas State ...

(a)Purpose: Excessive noise is a serious threat to the welfare, contentment, safety, health and the peace and quiet of the residents of the City. It is the intent of this Ordinance to establish requirements to prevent excessive noise that may jeopardize the health and welfare of its residents or degrade their quality of life.

### § 601.04 - NOISE CONTROL. regulates only the time, place...

Penal Code: Under the guidelines of Section 415 of the California Penal Code, it is illegal for any resident to knowingly create loud and unreasonable noises as a means of disturbing another. Those convicted of violating this law face a maximum of 90 days in jail and/or a

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maximum fine of \$400.00. Unnecessary noise can be a violation at any time.

### The Law of Noise Protection in California | Stimmel Law

Noise regulation includes statutes or guidelines relating to sound transmission established by national, state or provincial and municipal levels of government. After the watershed passage of the United States Noise Control Act of 1972, other local and state governments passed further regulations.

Existing local ordinances directed at noise control are generally oriented toward limitations on the level of noise emissions. Local governments may enact ordinances in an attempt to control noise produced by commercial and non-commercial activities (industry, motor vehicle traffic, race tracks, etc.).

### Guidelines for Drafting Municipal Noise Control Ordinances ...

The overall framework of the Noise Ordinance is to: Prohibit certain activities (prohibitions); Exclude certain activities from the Noise Ordinance (exceptions); and. When not specifically prohibited or excepted, then activities or sources of sound would be subject to maximum decibel levels.

Since 2012, the State of Florida allowed local jurisdictions to enforce laws regarding loud noises. The state law that governed such noises, like loud music from automobiles, was struck down by the Florida Supreme Court as unconstitutional that year. The chief problem with the law was found in its unequal relevance to different groups.

Noise in the workplace is commonly covered by labor regulations that spell out specific occupational limits for the lengths of time an employee may be exposed to noise of different decibel levels. These limits are based solely on the threat to hearing, not any other health effects of noise.

A noise disturbance, as defined by the Montgomery County Noise Law (56KB, PDF), is any sound that is: Unpleasant, annoying, offensive, loud, or obnoxious Unusual for the time of day or location where it is produced or heard

This is a summary and explanation of the UK and EC regulations relating to noise pollution. Emphasizing the impact of this law on industry, the text is the result of a special study made of the impact of environmental law on industrial and commercial activity.

Exposure to noise at home, at work, while traveling, and during leisure activities is a fact of life for all Americans. At times noise can be loud enough to damage hearing, and at lower levels it can disrupt normal living, affect sleep patterns, affect our ability to concentrate at work, interfere with outdoor recreational activities, and, in some cases, interfere with communications and even cause accidents. Clearly, exposure to excessive noise can affect our quality of life. As the population of the United States and, indeed, the world increases and developing countries become more industrialized, problems of noise are likely to become more pervasive and lower the quality of life for everyone. Efforts to manage noise exposures, to design quieter buildings, products, equipment, and transportation vehicles, and to provide a regulatory environment that facilitates adequate, cost-effective, sustainable noise controls require our immediate attention. The book also reviews the standards and regulations that govern noise levels and the federal, state, and local agencies that regulate noise for the benefit, safety, and wellness of society at large.
