Context Clues Definitions. Definition – when a sentence includes the definition or explanation of the unknown word. Synonym – a word that has the same meaning is used in the text. Antonym – a word that has the opposite meaning is used in the text. Example – an example is used to explain what the unknown word means.

7 Strategies For Using Context Clues In Reading. 1. Word Parts. The idea: Break down the different parts of a word—base word (word stem or root word), prefixes, and suffixes—to figure out what it means. Some words have a prefix only (reread), a suffix only (reading), both a prefix and a suffix (prereading), a combination (unreadableness), or neither (read).

Vocabulary Strategy: Using Context Clues When you encounter an unfamiliar word in your reading, one way to figure out the meaning is to use context clues. Context clues are hints about the meaning of an unknown word that may be found in the words, phrases, sentences, and paragraphs that surround that unknown word.

Vocabulary Strategy: Using Context Clues

These clues may include synonyms, antonyms, definitions or examples. Students can also use clues from meaningful word parts such as the base word, prefixes or suffixes. Four-step process used to guide students' use of context clues (Jennings, Caldwell and Lerner, 2014): 1. Look at the unfamiliar word - then read the sentence before and after the word

Steps to Understanding Vocabulary In-context. Step One: Punctuation. . Some texts use punctuation to include the definition or synonym immediately after the word. Look for parenthesis () commas , and dashes - right after the unknown word. .

Context clues—Information a reader may obtain from a text that helps confirm the meaning of a word or group of words. Denotation—The literal or “ dictionary ” meaning of a word. Synonym—One of two or more words in a language that have similar meanings (e.g., answer and re- spond).
